The contest affords young people the opportunity to write about their own opinions regarding the world in which they live. The approach can encompass a young person's personal experience, the experience of their country or a more historical perspective. In addition to developing skills for written expression, participants also have the opportunity win a college scholarship.

Topic: "How my Positive Outlook Benefits my Community"

When: Club Deadline Jan. 31, 2012 Who: Youth under age 19 as of 12/31/11 who have not yet graduated from high school

The Optimist International Essay Contest was first sponsored in 1983. Club winners advance to the District contest to compete for a \$2,500 college scholarship. Each District winner is automatically entered into the International Essay contest where a panel of judges selects the first-place winner. The international winner will receive an engraved plaque and recognition in *The Optimist* magazine.

The GEO Oratorical Contest Committee is now seeking entries for the Optimist International 2011-2012 Oratorical Contest. Every year since our foundation, we've actively recruited contestants from local schools, churches, other organizations, and our own members for our club's Oratorical Contest. This speech contest is designed to inspire today's youth to motivate and inform others through the art of public speaking. It provides young people with the opportunity to compete for a college scholarship and express their views on a preassigned topic.

Topic: "How my Optimism Helps me Overcome Obstacles" When: Club Deadline Mar. 3, 2012 Who: Youth under age 19 as of 12/31/11 who have not graduated from high school

Each contestant must prepare a speech that is five minutes in duration, and given in front of an audience and three judges. Optimist members and qualified members of the community are selected as judges. There's a girl's category and a boy's category. Our two club winners (one girl, one boy) will then compete at the Zone level. The winners of that contest will next move to an Area contest, which is comprised of Zones in the same geographical area, and those winners will then go on to the District finals to be held at the 3rd Quarterly Meeting in May 2012. District winners will each receive a \$2500 scholarship.
